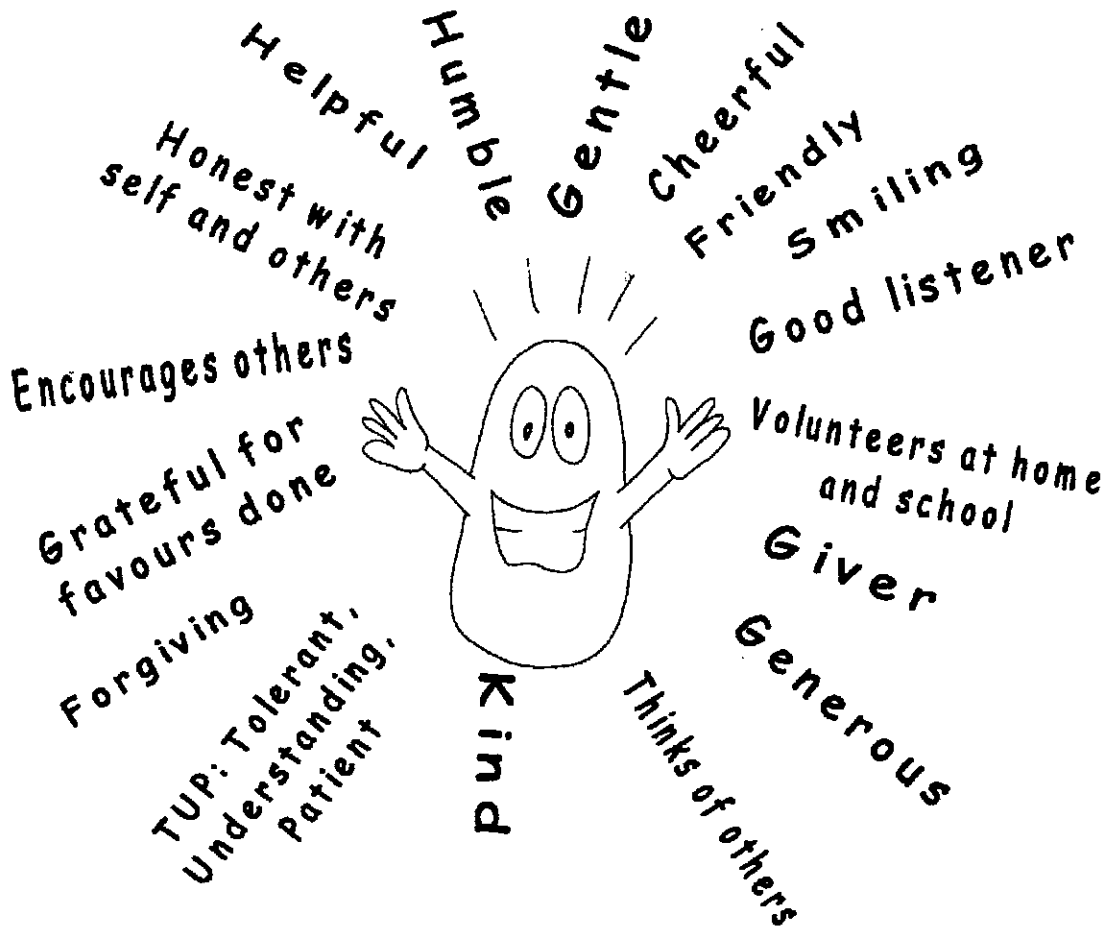

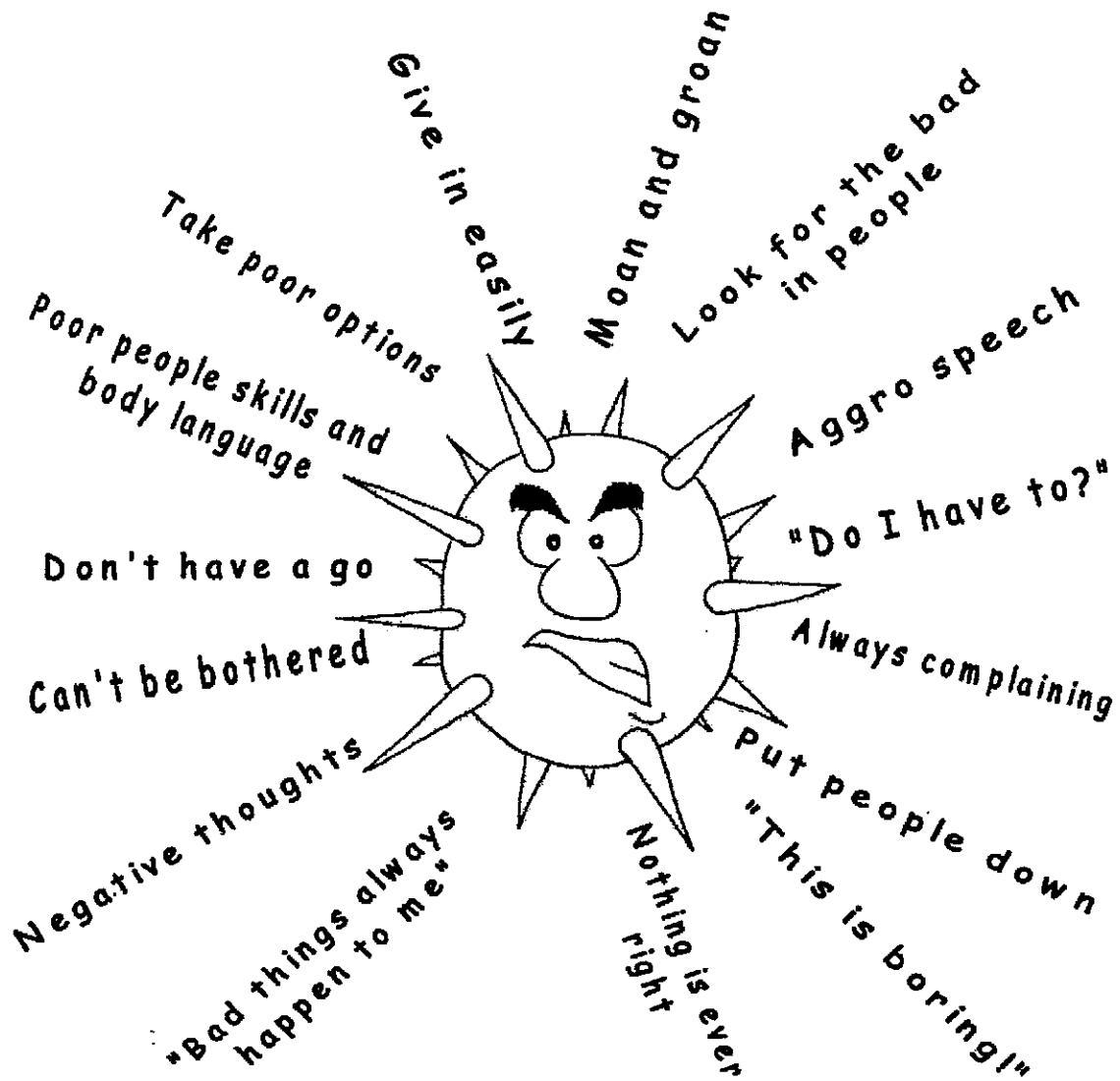

The wonderful Australian habit of saying G'day is often highlighted at special events such as the Olympics. Listen for the people who say G'day and hopefully imitate them.

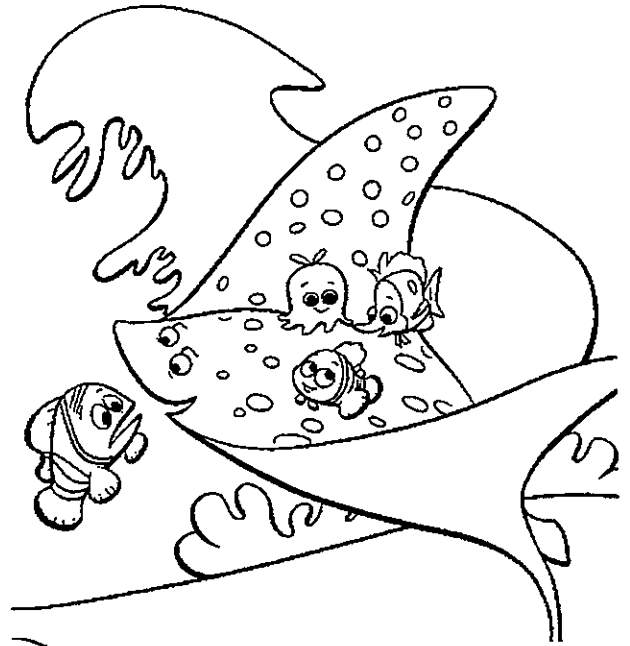


ENCOURAGEMENT

Listen to the story "In with a Splash"

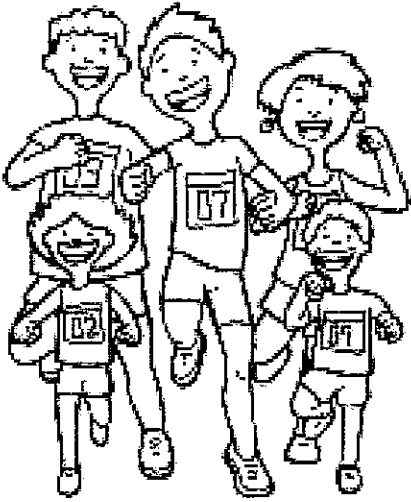
Flipper encouraged Little Penguin to swim. Little Penguin encouraged Baby Polar Bear to swim. Did they enjoy swimming? Why?

Draw yourself encouraging one of your friends.



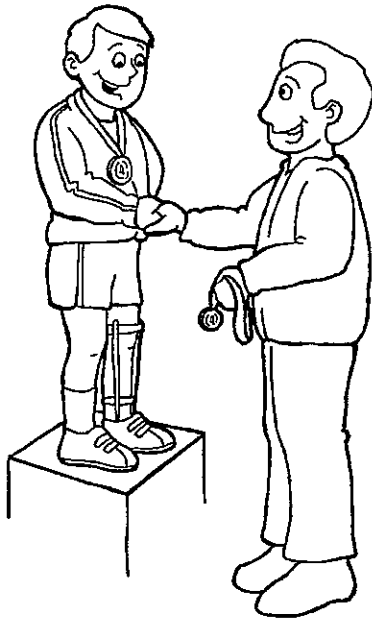
How can we encourage others?
